GENERAL RULES: This Show is conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution and rules of the Society and any regulation which appears within the Schedule for individual sections of this Show. Should there be any conflict between the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution and rules of this society and the regulations appearing in any schedule, the constitution, rules and regulations appearing in this schedule of this Society shall prevail.

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Association in addition to any special regulations which appear within this Schedule. Please refer to each section.

The Society reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reasons for doing so.

PRIZE MONEY: All prizes are paid on the authority of the award entered in the Judge's Book. When such prizes are paid, to whomever they are paid, the Society's responsibilities cease, and no claim can afterwards be entered. All prize winners are requested to obtain prizes from the Secretary's Office on Show days. Where the prizes are stated as having been donated by a particular person or company, they take the place of the Society's prizes, and are not in addition unless expressly stated. In the event of a tie, prize money will be divided. In awarding trophies, the committee may provide prize money and trophy to the value of the stated trophy.

EXHIBITS: Where display space is limited, preference will be given to prize winning exhibits. No exhibits may be removed without the consent of the Stewards. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the Exhibitor may be transferred to the proper class by the Stewards.

JUDGING: The Judge need not award any prize to an exhibit that in his/her opinion does not comply with the conditions. In the judging of Livestock, all questions as to the eligibility of any exhibit with reference to age or breed shall be decided by the Judge. If necessary, judging the class may be deferred until the Exhibitor has produced proof. The Judge may award Second prize if the exhibit is not worthy of a first and shall not award any prize if the Exhibit is not considered to be sufficient merit.

STEWARDS: Stewards are responsible for the return of all exhibits to owners. The Judge is to be furnished with a Schedule of Prizes, but no information as to the name or place of the owner of the exhibits. Stewards shall affix prize cards and any ribbons to the Prize exhibits.

PROTESTS: The Steward of each section shall settle any dispute arising there in, but the exhibitor has the privilege of lodging a written protest against any decision thus given, which will be dealt with by the Committee, whose ruling is final. All protests must be lodged with the Secretary in writing with a deposit of \$50 not later than half an hour after the award has been made. The deposit, in any protest considered frivolous will be forfeited to the Society.

SOCIETY'S RESPONSIBILITIES: All competitors compete at their own risk. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may occur to any exhibit at the Show, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from the accident. The Society will not under any consideration, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or miss delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's show.

Any prize not claimed during the Show will be forfeited to the Society. Exhibitors and persons admitted to the grounds shall be subject to the Rules, Regulations and Orders of the Stewards and are required to pay normal admission prices unless exempted by the Association. The foregoing Rules and Regulations, Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, and the Notes as set forth in the Schedule are the conditions of competition. Any matter arising not specially provided for in the foregoing shall be determined by the Committee, whose decisions shall be final.

6. All animals not thoroughly tractable will not be allowed to compete.

8. Judging to be on the basis of merit of the animal for breeding purposes.
9. Any animal, which in the opinion of the stewards is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected.
10. Cattle with visible ticks will not be allowed to compete. **ALL CATTLE MUST BE TICK FREE**

YOUNG PARADERS – STUD BEEF

Competition to commence following the the Led Steer/Heifer classes

Conditions of Entry:

To be eligible for the State Finals competitors must comply with all of these Rules. These competitions are designed to determine the parader who presents and parades an animal before a judge most effectively. Paraders will parade their animals in a clockwise manner as is normal in a Cattle Judging Ring at the discretion of the judge.

1. Competitors must be 15 and under 25 years of age on the 1st of May in the year of the State Final in order to compete at Sub-Chamber and Chamber level.
2. Competitors under 18 years of age must have the approval of a parent or guardian to compete.
3. Competitors are to be a resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to competing or attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under Rule 5.
4. Competitors residing over the border who can prove an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided that they satisfy one of the following criteria:-
 - a) Their address has a Queensland postcode;
 - b) They have a Queensland phone number;
 - c) The competitor or their parents are active working members of that show.
5. National winners are ineligible to compete.

PROCEDURE:

1. One class of Paraders is to be judged.
2. Beef Cattle Paraders may lead a Steer, Heifer or Bull under 20 months.
3. Paraders must wear a white coat and not display any name or logo.

Class 1 Young Paraders – Stud Beef – under 15yrs.

Class 2 Young Paraders – Stud Beef – 15yrs to 25yrs

YOUNG JUDGES

Conditions of Entry:

1. The Hormel Slide System will be used.
2. Competitors must be 15 and under 25 years of age on the 1st of May in the year of the State Final in order to compete at Sub-Chamber and Chamber level.
3. Competitors under 18 years of age must have the approval of a parent or guardian to compete.
4. Competitors are to be a resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to competing or attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under Rule 5.
5. Competitors residing over the border who can prove an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry provided that they satisfy one of the following criteria: -
 - a) Their address has a Queensland postcode;
 - b) They have a Queensland phone number;
 - c) The competitor or their parents are active working members of that show.
6. National winners or persons on a national judging panel for that event are ineligible to compete.

Conditions of Entry:

1. **All exhibitors must pay entry onto the showground.**
2. **BIO SECURITY-** it is compulsory to complete a Horse Health Declaration for ALL horses entering an affiliated Agricultural Society Showgrounds. **(Biosecurity forms at back)**
3. Nominations on show day - will be by ticket system, available from the ticket office on show day. The ticket office will be located in Ring Centre.
4. **ALL HORSES ENTERED IN BREED CLASSES MUST BE REGISTERED AND PROVIDE A COPY OF RELEVANT REGISTRATION.**
5. This show is conducted subject to the rules of the QLD Chamber of Agricultural Societies and rules of this schedule.
6. **ALL Rings will stop at 2:30pm** for the Show Opening and re-commence at its conclusion.
7. **All prize money will be paid at the Secretary's office and must be collected and signed for after 12pm on show day. A card will be issued to the winners of each class.**
8. **All riders and competitors compete at their own risk and the Goomeri and District Show Society Inc or its servants accept no responsibility in any respect for any account or any mishap to competitors, animals, property or onlookers, which may occur.**
9. The age of a horse shall be calculated from the 1st day of August. Every horse foaled before the 1st of August shall be deemed one year old on that date.
10. Where the height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured in the presence of the ring steward if required and at the judge's discretion.
11. **NO RINGS WILL BE HELD FOR ANY COMPETITOR. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO BE READY ON TIME FOR CLASSES.**
12. **Ponies may be ridden by riders of any age. However, common sense must prevail to ensure ponies are not over-mounted / over-weighted and rider safety is maintained.**
13. Stallions are not permitted in hack classes.
14. No stallion is to be moved around a venue without a suitable restraint. The restraint can be either a bridle, or an anti- rearing bit or a chain lead rein over the nose or under the jaw.

15. An exhibit is ineligible to compete if the horse has been owned or leased by the judge, a member of his/her family, his employer or business partner within three months of this show.
16. Stewards reserve the right to add additional classes should there be sufficient numbers.
17. District classes are confined to horses and riders permanently residing in the following areas - Goomeri, Tansey, Murgon, Wondai, Kilkivan, Nanango & Kingaroy.
18. Local classes are confined to horses and riders residing in the following areas - Goomeri, Tansey, Cinnabar, Kilkivan and Murgon.
19. Horses and riders must have been permanent residents of these areas for 3 months prior to show day.
20. **Judges and Stewards are to dismiss any entry from the ring where there are any perceived Animal Welfare, or safety concerns involving any rider, horse or its gear.**
21. It is the responsibility of the competitors to not knowingly bring sick animals (eg. Diarrhoea, cold/flu, infectious skin condition) onto the showgrounds.
22. **According to the Equestrian Australia regulation helmets must be worn and must have proof of meeting the required standards (yellow sticker).**
23. Vouchers to the same monetary value may be given in lieu of prize money.
24. Ring plan located at back of schedule.
25. Definitions –

Maiden – Horses must be maidens at the time of competing. “Maiden” shall be deemed to mean any horse that has not won a first prize at any affiliated show.

Novice – Horses must be novices at the time of competition. “Novice” shall be deemed to mean any horse that has not won a championship prize at any affiliated Society Show or Open Challenge.

Pony – Must not exceed 14 hands.

Galloway – Must be over 14 hands and not exceed 15.

Coloured Breeds – registered breeds representing a recognized colour, eg. Palomino, buckskin, paint, appaloosa.

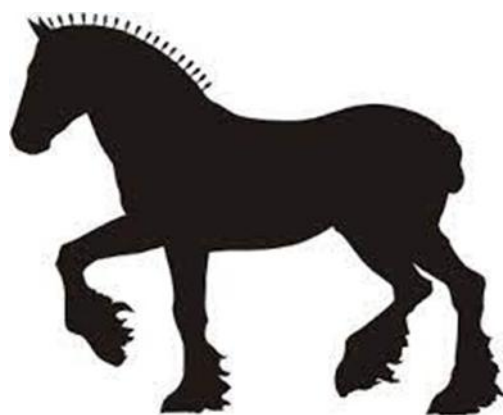

SMARTIE BISCUITS**Ingredients:**

125-gram butter, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup castor sugar, 1 egg, 1 1/4 cups plain flour, 3/4 cup self-raising flour, 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla essence, 1 pkt smarties

Method:

Preheat oven to 180 deg C. Line trays with baking paper. Cream butter and sugars, beat well. Add egg and vanilla essence. Lastly sifted flours and soda. Place 1/2 tablespoon full of mixture on greased tray. Flatten slightly. Place a smartie in centre of mixture. Bake for approx. 10-12 mins or until a light golden colour. Leave on tray to cool.

CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES**Ingredients:**

125-gram butter, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 60g walnut pieces, 1 cup brown sugar lightly packed, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 egg, 125 g chocolate chips, 1 3/4 cups self-raising flour

Method:

Cream together butter, sugars and vanilla. Add lightly beaten egg gradually, beating well. Mix in sifted flour and salt. Add chocolate chips and chopped walnuts, mix well. Shape teaspoonfuls of mixture into small balls, place on lightly greased oven trays, allow room for spreading. Bake in moderate oven for 10 to 12 minutes. Makes about 45.

1/2 cup self-raising flour, 1/2 cup plain flour, 2 tablespoons cocoa, 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed), 125gms unsalted butter (melted), 1 egg (lightly beaten), 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/3 cup white baking bits, 1/3 cup milk baking bits. **Icing** – 1/2 cup icing sugar, 1 tablespoon cocoa, 1 tablespoon hot water

Method:

Grease 18cm x 28cm rectangular pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 2cm above pan edges. Sift combined flours and cocoa into a large bowl. Stir in sugar. Make a well in the centre. Stir in butter, egg and vanilla until combined. Spread evenly in prepared pan. Sprinkle over combined baking bits. Gently press into top of slice. Cook in a moderate oven (180 deg C) for about 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Cool the slice in pan. To make icing, combine all ingredients in a bowl. Stir until smooth. Transfer to a snap-lock bag. Squeeze into one corner. Twist bag. Snip tip. Drizzle icing over slice. Lift onto chopping board. Cut into squares.

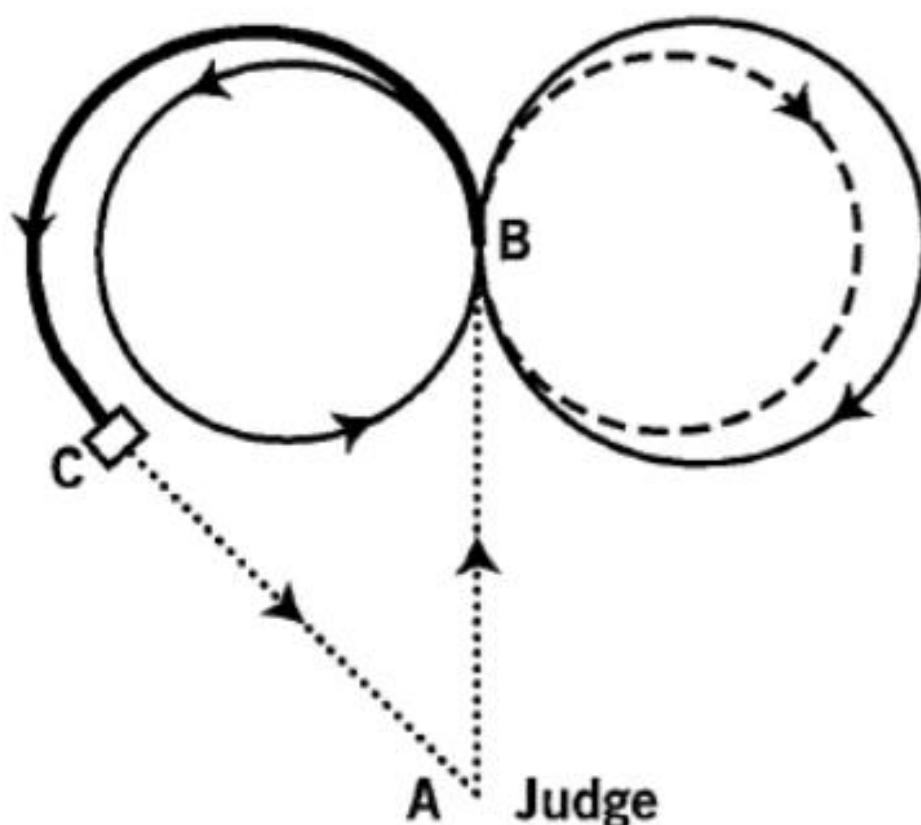

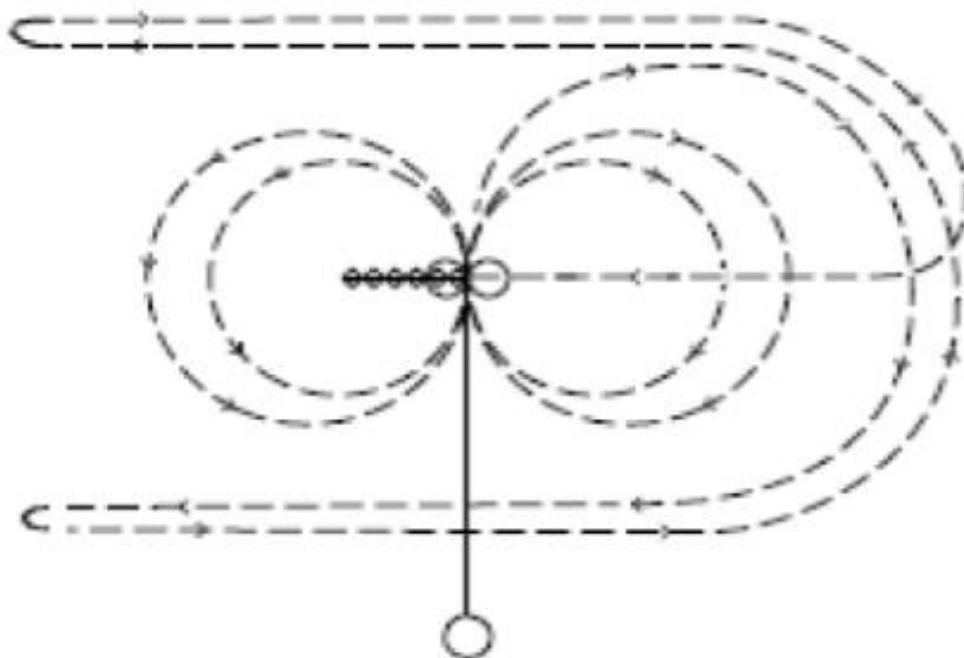

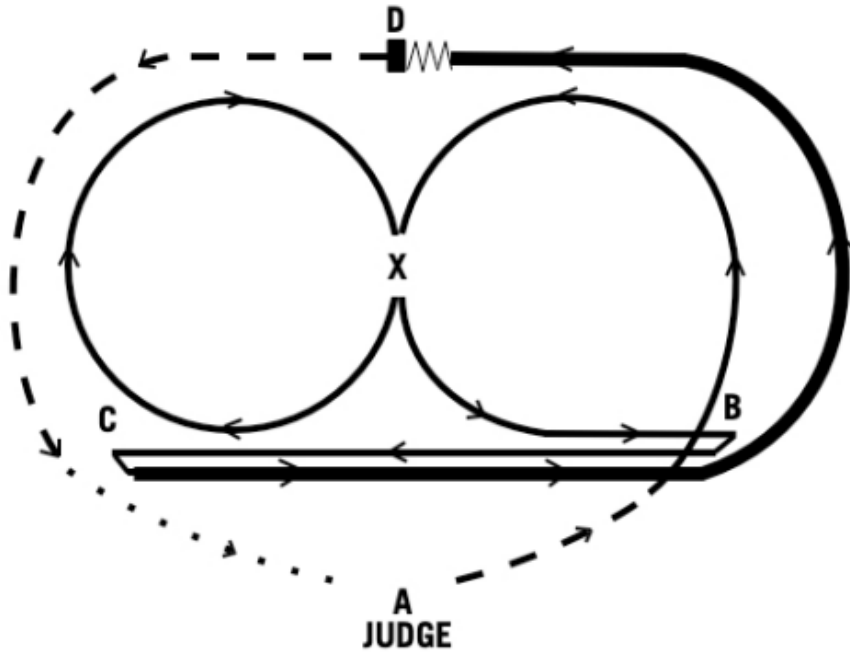
